3.0 Career Prospect:

Social workers work in a range of setting including: schools, hospitals, non-governmental organisations, in the courts and public service. Large corporations employ social workers to give guidance on various social impact assessments to the environment. Some social workers work as probation officers. Probation officers work closely with juvenile offenders in prisons so that they can help assess the juvenile justice system and to make recommendations to the courts about whether or not to mete out certain punishments to juvenile offenders. Others work in the public sector to assess vulnerability in communities. They give counsel to the state about social cash transfer schemes and benefits vulnerable families can have access to.
