

1.0 Introduction

The Bachelor of International Relations was developed in order to address the demand for diplomatic services personnel. This four year under graduate programme is intended for those seeking a career in the diplomatic service. It has been designed to contribute to the development of the much needed International Relations personnel who would be capable of functioning at different levels of the diplomatic services with world at large.

The degree programme provides an opportunity for students to explore the models of traditional International Relations and the "New Public International Relations vis-à-vis Strategic International Relations". In the first and second year of study, students are introduced to a thorough introduction in Communication skills, political science, economics, public administration and law. In addition, they get to choose to learn at least one diplomatic language; French or Chinese (Mandarin).

During the final two years, students are expected to apply their analytical skills in areas of; research, diplomatic etiquette and protocol, international regional corporations, environmental issues, global governance, peace, conflict and security studies, international migration and various political issues.
